

## Boulevards

Boulevards are sections of city owned property along roadways that allow space for important infrastructure such as city sidewalks, boulevard trees, fire hydrants and underground utilities.

Boulevard measurements for streets in new subdivisions are:

## Choosing a Tree

These are trees that are well suited to boulevards in our environment:

- Silver Maple** – *Acer saccharinum*
- Amur Maple** – *Acer ginnala*
- Manitoba Maple** – *Acer negundo*
- Alder** – *Alnus hirsuta*
- Paper Birch** – *Betula papyrifera*
- Hawthorn** – *Crataegus x mordenesis*
- White Ash** – *Fraxinus americana*
- Green Ash** – *Fraxinus pennsylvanica*
- Spring Snow Crab** – *Malus ‘Spring Snow’*
- Pin Oak** – *Quercus ellipsoidalis*
- Bur Oak** – *Quercus macrocarpa*
- Japanese Tree Lilac** – *Syringa reticulata*
- American Basswood** – *Tilia americana*
- Little Leaf Linden** – *Tilila cordata*
- Elm** – *Ulmus spp*

Please note that not all trees listed are suited to all boulevards. The Parks and Recreation Dept will work with you to choose a suitable tree species if required.

## When will my trees arrive?

Have your application in no later than the last Friday in November and your trees will be made available for pick up in May. You will be notified of the pick up dates and details in spring.

By accepting the tree(s), you are accepting responsibility to plant and care for the tree(s) for the first 3 years. You will be responsible for the planting, watering and general care of the tree(s). After the first 3 years, the boulevard trees become the responsibility of the City.

At pick up, you will be given instructions on how to plant the tree(s) and be required to sign a tree care agreement. If your trees are not planted on the boulevard as intended, you may be required to pay the cost of the tree(s).



## Ordering a Boulevard Tree

Submit your application by the second Friday in February to be included in this year's order. Trees must be picked up – a truck or large SUV is strongly recommended. You must plant your tree on the boulevard and water it for three years.
